DEATHS.

At 101, Stephen's-green, Dublin, on Saturday, Thomas M. Wilson, Esq. of Cahirconlish House, in this County, formerly Captain 59th Regt.—A gentleman, whether as a husband, a parent, landlord, or friend, could not be surpassed. His death is deeply lamented. His remains were yesterday interred in the family vault, at Cahirconlish Church, attended by a number of the gentry of the city and county of Limerick, and by his devoted tenantry, who removed the remains of their beloved landlord from the Boher railway station to Cahirconlish Church, amid audible expressions of grief from the country people.

Yesterday morning, at the family residence in Glentworth-street, of malignant typhus fever, to which his father became a victim only five days before, Thomas Lloyd, Esq. eldest son of the late Doctor Edward Lloyd, of this City, to attend whose sick bed the above young gentleman, with affectionate solicitude, hastened from Dublin; and, in the exercise of filial duty, imbibed the infection of that fatal disease, which his father had contracted in ministering to the sick poor of the union. The feeling of commiseration for Dr. Lloyd's family, thus stricken by two most severe domestic calamities, is universal, as it is sincere.
