His Worship briefly addressed the Grand Jury, informing them that their duties would be light, as a number of the prisoners in custody for trial had already been convicted at the recent Quarter Sessions of Rathkeale and Bruff. The bills of indictment would be immediately sent up against those still remaining in custody.

At the city court-house on Wednesday, Patrick Scanlan was sentenced to one month's imprisonment for an assault on Mr. Scott, master of the workhouse ; Honora Mullins, charged with stealing £5 from her master, was remanded ; the celebrated "Bill Danaher" was fined 5s. or 48 hours for being drunk and annoying the streets.

At the City Police-office, on Thursday, a number of vagrants were brought up, and ordered to the workhouse ; James Collopy and Samuel Benson were sentenced to 14 days imprisonment each, for stealing hay at the Cornmarket ; four paupers from Mountkennet workhouse, were sentenced to 21 days imprisonment each, and to be whipped twice, for breaking the windows of Mr. Hurly, in that neighbourhood ; John Lysaght, drunk in the streets, fined 1s. and costs.

At the Sanitary Court, on Thursday, 21 cases of nuisance were disposed of, and the defendants ordered to abate same.

Owen Connors, a sawyer, was killed at Loughgur on Wednesday, a large beam of timber having fallen on him from the platform into the pit, where he worked.

There were 200 prisoners tried before Mr. Berwick at Mallow sessions last week, including Timothy Riordan, for robbery of chalice and communion cloth from Glountain chspel, to be transported for life.

The bakery and stable of Mrs. Currin, Abbeyside, Dungarvan, was burnt down on Friday morning.

Friday last three valuable ploughs, the property of a farmer named White, residing at Three Castles, Kilkenny, were maliciously broken and destroyed in the field where they had been left.

Friday night the cow-house and stables of William Maxey and Stephen Keating, the former of Moylartown, the latter of Powerstown, Tipperary, were entered, and the tails of 26 cows and four horses cut off, and the horse-collars opened and the hair taken away.
