On Tuesday last an inquest was held at Green-
hills by James Bennett, Esq. Coroner, upon the body
of Wm. Brown, who was killed the previous evening

posed to the cause of death. A jury returned a verdict
accordingly. The other men are dangerously ill from
wounds received in this unfortunate affray. Head-

implicated, who are to stand their trial next assizes.

Patrick and John Howe, Michael M'Mahon, and
Biddy Keogh, arrested by Head-Constable Power, of
Kilrush, for the murder of Arthur O'Donnell, Esq., of
Derrynaliska, on the night of the 10th ult., have been
fully committed to Ennis gaol for trial at next assizes,
and there is ample evidence against them. Much
praise is due to Head-Constable Power for his exer-
tions in making the party amenable.

Bridget Thompson, mother of Catherine Moore, who
was executed last month for the murder of her hus-
band, died of fever on Saturday, in the gaol at Mary-
borough. She had been sentenced to transportation
for life, as an accessory after the fact.

We are happy to state that Miss Armit, the very
young lady, so grossly handled by two scoundrel bai-
liffs near Merrion, last week, who pretended she was
a Miss Creagh, whom they were to arrest for debt, is
progressing fast to recovery, and her father, Richard
Armit, Esq. is determined to prosecute both fellows

Coroner, Mr. Davis, under whose warrant they acted.

Doctor George Douglas and Dr. Jacques, of Quebec,
composing the Quarantine Medical Staff at Grosse-Isle,
did not proceed down to the island before the 1st of
May, having received instruction from Government
to that effect. The first arrival at Quebec from sea
this spring was the ship *Montreal*, Capt. M'Masters,
from Liverpool, 17th April. By the Quarantine Law,
this year, none but emigrant vessels are bound to stop
at Gross-Isle. Messrs. Sands and Howes, the Ameri-
can Circus proprietors, are about establishing an over-
land route to California, by caravans of camels, accor-
ding to the Eastern manner of travelling over desert
countries. The first caravan will start on the 1st of
June. The Reserve Battalion of the 23d, ordered to
London, Canada West, has been stationed for the
last three years in Montreal. The 19th leave for
Toronto, to be replaced by the 20th from Kings-
ton. Tancred Boutillier, Esq., is appointed Collector
of Customs at Montreal. A company of the
