THE LIMERICK CHRONICLE.

SATURDAY EVENING, JUNE 22.

This afternoon, the mortal remains of the late Dowager Countess of Limerick arrived by railway, at the Limerick station, where a hearse and six horses, with sable plumes and housing, waited to remove the body to its last resting place, in Pery Chapel of the Cathedral. The bells of St. Mary's were tolled during the day. Several of the relatives and friends of the deceased lady waited at the terminus to pay a last tribute of respect to her memory, amongst whom were George Lake Russell, Esq., son-in-law of deceased, Hon. Stephen Spring Rice, and M. Russell, jun. grandson of deceased, Sir Vere De Vere, Stephen De Vere, Esq., Archdeacon Maunsell, Wm.
