Professor Shaw of Cork Queen's College, and F. T. C. D. with his sister, returning to his house at Cork on Thursday morning, was attacked and attempted to be robbed by a set of ruffians, who only were prevented by some respectable persons coming up.

Monday last was the anniversary of St. Swithen, the rainy Saint, and, what is very unusual, not one drop fell at Limerick, in commemoration of his annual cycle.

Yesterday morning, at six, the moon entered on her first quarter; therefore, we anticipate no interruption of the present glorious summer weather for a week to come at least.

A water spout of great length and dimensions was observable by the passengers on board the *Erin-go-Bragh* steamer, between 6 and 7 o'clock last evening, in the vicinity of Trough and Broadford. The descent from the clouds was perpendicular, and owing to the immense body of water which fell, the vale beneath must have been inundated.

There was heavy rain on the Dublin, Cork, and Clare lines, last Monday, and a fall of rain yesterday and this morning, which has abated the great heat of the weather.

Patrick Shaughnessy, an old man returning from this City to Six-mile-bridge paper mills, on Monday evening, fell off his loaded car at Meelick, and the wheel passing over his body he died almost immediately.

James Browne, a young man, coffin maker by trade, from John's-gate, went to swim with another person in the afternoon of yesterday, at the Canal, while in a state of inebriety and excitement. He sunk almost immediately after immersion a lifeless corpse!

Yesterday 19 persons were severally committed to prison, 4 for breaking out of Mount-kennett workhouse, 2 months and to be well whipped.
