DEATHS.

On Thursday last, at the County Court House, quite suddenly, JEREMIAH SHINE, Esq. of Edwardstown, in the 72d year of his age. Newspaper obituary will convey a faint estimate of the profound sensation felt in City and County at this most unexpected and lamentable event, and of the universal sympathy expressed for his family at their sudden bereavement. It is some consolation under such a calamity that we may echo the public sentiment, by recording the warm sense of Mr. Shine's great moral worth and high integrity, long and intimately known as he was to the citizens of Limerick and the landed gentry and farmers of the County, with whom he mixed as a friend, neighbour, and man of business for many years, in the enjoyment of a character so amiable and excellent in every circumstance and condition of life, that his children must feel proud to embrace the honorable example of such a parent for their future model in this world.

We might add that Mr. Shine was an extensive agriculturist, of great practical knowledge in husbandry, and one of the best judges of stock in Munster. In the jury box his temper, firmness, discernment, and truly upright bearing, ever commanded the respect and confidence of the bench and bar, whether at Nisi Prius or Crown side.

The remains of this much lamented gentleman will be removed to-morrow morning for interment in the family burial-place, at Ardagh, in the west of the county Limerick.
