These articles are so very light as easily to be had by post; and those kindhearted ladies who can fel for wretchedness, and sympathise with their Christian brethren and sisters, struggling to alleviate a famine-stricken people, are solicited to extend their patronage to this humble effort in their behalf. It is combining, what never should be separated, unless for special purposes-Industry and Charity.
