DEATHS.

On Thursday morning last, at his residence, in Thomas-
street, after an illness of several weeks duration, John Crips,
Esq. a Magistrate and formerly Mayor of this City. In the dis-
charge of his public duties for a series of years, no gentleman
holding the commission of the peace could display more per-
sonal energy and constitutional temper, whenever the welfare of
his fellow-citizens was concerned; and there were critical occa-
sions of political and local excitement in which his active influ-
ence produced the happy effect of appeasing hostile parties and
subduing great popular commotion, without actual violence.
Prompt and decisive when riot and outrage prevailed, his for-
bearance and consideration were equally conspicuous: thus
admirably blending the strict duties of a public officer with the
natural benevolence and refined courtesy of a perfect gentle-
man—qualities for which he stood pre-eminently high in the
estimation of every class of his fellow-citizens. It is almost
superfluous to add that he lived in the esteem and regard of a
large circle of friends, and died universally regretted. The re-
mains of the late Alderman Crips were interred this morning in
the family vault at Cahirnarry Church.
