A Kilrush correspondent writes :- "I think it right to mention to you that there is not one word of truth in the letter which appeared in a late number of a Limerick newspaper, from one of the Kilrush Relieving Officers, who stated that Benjamin Cox, Esq., gave out-door relief to his own labourers as well as other favourites. Mr. Cox had all the parties he was so charged with before the board on Saturday, to contradict the above statement, but Col. Vandeleur and Mr. Briscoe thought it better not to press the investigation pending an inquiry into the conduct of the auditor towards him, which Mr. Cox thinks will reveal strange things, and show that there was a decided intention on the part of persons in power to obstruct the working of the present board at Kilrush, and this has been proved before the late parliamentary enquiry."
