A letter from the Board of Customs was read, confirmatory of our previous announcement, that it had been decided to change the revenue boarding station from Scatterry to Tarbert, an alteration which, the chairman repeated, was most desirable, for the mercantile and shipping inter-ests. A letter from Mr. Reay was read, complaining of delay and inconvenience experienced by the public in consequence of the Swivel, at Wellesley bridge, being kept open too long, while turf boats are passing. The matter was referred to the Harbour Master. A committee was appointed to take an office for the Harbour Master, as the premises in Henry-st. are to be given up on 1st Nov.

The *Scandinavian*, a Swedish vessel, laden with corn, and consigned to Jas. Bannatyne, Esq., having, without consulting the Harbour Master, come too near Palmer's creek, on Tuesday, grounded, and got her back broken.

Wednesday night last, a bailiff named Andy, was shot dead at Newtown, near Pallasgreen. He went to serve an order from the Tipperary Bank on Luby, a farmer, who, on seeing the bailiff, enter deliberately, laid hold of his gun, and advancing too within one or two yards of him fired, and litterly tore open the belly and side of the unfortunate man.
