## THE LIMERICK CHRONICLE.

WEDNESDAY EVENING, OCTOBER 30.

It is our painful duty to communicate the loss of the worthy Representative for this County, Samuel Dickson, Esq. whose decease took place at his house in George-street, early on Monday morning last.— Having devoted the energies of an active and vigorous mind during a long life to the service of his native County and City, for both of which he performed with strict impartiality the duties of Magistrate and High Sheriff, he was, on the last vacancy, unani- mously chosen by this County its representative in Parliament. His faithful discharge of the duties thus confided to him, and his untiring devotion to every measure calculated to advance the good of his coun- try, perhaps, hastened the sad event which, in com- mon with his constituents, we now sincerely lament. His remains will leave this on Saturday morning at 8 o'clock for interment in the family vault at Croom.

The vacant Parliamentary seat for this county, by the disqualification of Wm. Smith O'Brien, filled up on the 1st June, 1849, by the unopposed election of Samuel Dickson, Esq. M.P. is again vacant by the lamented death of that truly independent and honora- ble gentleman.

Samuel Auchmuty Dickson, Esq., recently Captain 13th Light Dragoons, only son of the late Major- General Dickson, East India Company's service, will offer himself to the electors as a candidate for the vacant seat in its representation, so efficiently filled by his deceased uncle.

Capt. Bateson, of the Life Guards, has arrived in this city to attend the funeral of his uncle, S. Dickson, Esq. M.P.

Mr. Wyndham Gould, who is announced a candidate for this county, has arrived in Limerick.

The present qualified electoral constituency of the county Limerick does not amount to 400.

The first meeting of the Limerick Hunt this season, appointed for yesterday, by Captain Dickson, did not come off, in consequence of the unexpected death of Samuel Dickson, Esq., M.P.
