The Erin steamer has left for Dingle to bring round
the Shannon a large foreign vessel in distress, with 400
tons Indian corn on board.

Michael O'Malley, a carpenter, of this city, and a
labouring man named Conway, were drowned on
Wednesday evening, while crossing the river from
Tervoe to Coonagh, a small punt in which they were,
having upset. Their bodies were found next day.

The Cork fishery conservators have reduced the cost
of license on seine nets from 30s. to 20s., on the mo-
tion of Mr. Sam Keays.

Walter Berwick, Esq. Assistant Barrister, after
opening Cork Sessions on Monday, called the at-
tention of the Grand Jury to the necessity of building
District Bridewells. In the County Cork there was
but one gaol while there are six counties in Ireland,
each of which has its peculiar gaol. On going over
the committals for this year, he had reckoned 129
prisoners who had been committed at enormous ex-
pense to the county, the distances ranging from 40 to
75 miles to undergo a sentence of 14 days imprison-
ment, while 8 persons were sent a distance of 72 miles
to be imprisoned for 48 hours, the period of whose
imprisonment must have expired before they reached
the gaol gate! A sum of £1,170 would be sufficient
to build each district Bridewell—thus even in a pecuni-
ary point of view the county would be benefitted as
far as the expenditure of two sums of £1,170 each,
there would be a gain of nearly £700 per annum to
the county on the travelling expenses.
