Registration of Voters

BY the Parliamentary Voters' Act it is provided, that where the Franchise is derived from Household Property, the number of the house, if any, is to be inserted in the List of Voters, as settled at the Revision Court. The defective and irregular numeration of houses, in this City will make it necessary for all persons having or claiming to have, the Franchise, to satisfy themselves that the numbers of the houses, where they are given in the Town Clerk's Lists, are accurate, and where they are not given, to supply them. This is the more necessary, as there is no Register or Book which discloses any numbers of houses in Limerick.
