Monday last, of typhus fever, Mr. Thomas Browne, of the
Linen Hall, in this city, a gentleman universally lamented by
his friends and fellow citizens. As a manufacturer, extensively
engaged in trade, he was most intelligent, enterprising and
indefatigable in the encouragement of Irish operative indus-
try; while as a vigilant and useful guardian of the Limerick
union he devoted himself assiduously to the removal of work-
house abuses and irregularities, which are perhaps, necessarily
incidental to every union in Ireland. Mr. Browne has left a
wife and three children to deplore his premature death. This
afternoon his remains were interred at Kilmichel, county
Clare, followed from Limerick by a host of sorrowing friends.
