

Thomas Scott, Thomas Pinucane, Thomas M'Namara, Patrick Madigan, Danl. Dundon, and John Mulcahy, convicted of an extensive robbery in the Diocesan house of Rev. Mr. Hogg, were each sentenced to 7 years' transportation.

George Yellon was then indicted for obtaining goods in Limerick under false pretences. The witnesses examined were Mr. Wright, boot-manufacturer, and Mr. Bull, saddler, who proved the fraudulent representations of the prisoner, under the fictitious name of Hon. Captain Jocelyn. The jury found him guilty, without leaving the court. The Barrister, after consulting with the magistrates on the bench, sentenced the prisoner to 12 months imprisonment and hard labour.

John Cox, Margaret Cox, and John Boland, were found guilty of larceny in the house of Rev. B. Jacob, and sentenced to 6 months imprisonment at hard labour; John M'Namara, larceny of a watch from Mr. E. Welsh, to be imprisoned 12 months. Michael Tuohy was sentenced to 7 years transportation, for stealing tweed from Mr. Beveridge; Michael Hogan, larceny of sheets, 6 months imprisonment, and three times whipped. Michael O'Keefe, violent and wanton assault on private Thos. Grubb, 6th Dragoon Guards, at night, in the streets, to be transported for 7 years.
