**SUDDEN DEATH**—Between 11 and 12 o'clock on Sunday, Julia Davis, dress-maker, of Dominick-street, aged 26 years, when returning from Mass at St. Michael's Chapel, where she received the sacrament, dropt dead in Catherine-street, at the corner leading into Roche's-street. She was immediately removed into a house adjoining, where the Rev. Mr. Molloy, O. S. D, promptly visited her, with Dr. Parker, but life was extinct. When she fell on the flagway blood issued from nose and mouth, and on subsequent enquiry it was ascertained that the young woman, who bore an excellent character, had been a long time labouring from consumption.
