William Quan, porter in the drapery concerns of  
Messrs. Evans George-st. was arrested on Thursday by  
Serjeant Reidy for having stolen several valuable silk  
handkerchiefs and other articles, the property of the  
firm. On being searched a number of pawn tickets  
were found on his person, (duplicates of goods pur-  
loined,) and on close inspection of the shop it was  
discovered that he had concealed other articles of the  
fancy trade beneath one of the counters. The prisoner  
has been committed to the city gaol.

There are 17 youngsters in the city gaol under  
sentence of imprisonment and whipping for picking  
pockets.

On Thursday night some expert robbers scaled the  
wall of Barrington's hospital, convenient to the Po-  
lice station, and carried off a quantity of bed cover-  
ing and wearing apparel which was drying in the yard.

Monday evening George Duncan, aged 7 years, son  
of a ship carpenter, was found drowned near the Pa-  
tent slip, North-strand, having, it is supposed fallen  
out of a boat in which he was amusing himself.

The house of Mr. Russell, dealer, John's-gate, was  
secretly entered by the yard wall, on Wednesday  
night, and robbed of wearing apparel.

Mackin, the travelling pedlar, against whom a war-  
rant was issued by the city magistrates, on suspicion  
of having robbed William Murphy of £17, in John-st.,  
has not been yet apprehended. Murphy had gold  
watches value £300 in his possession when the money  
was taken.

John Cooney, formerly workman of the canal boats  
in Limerick, was charged before the Lord Mayor of  
London, on Tuesday last, with uttering an Irish  
banknote which had been altered from £3 to £10.—  
The prisoner, an illiterate man, who is believed to  
have been the ignorant victim of others was discharged  
for want of evidence.

A quantity of hay and straw at Rhebogue was  
maliciously burned a few nights ago.

Yesterday morning 40 convicts from the County  
gaol, and nine from the City, were transmitted hence  
to Spike Island, *via* railway to Cork, in charge of  
sub Inspector Heard, and party of Constabulary.

Four hundred convicts from Woolwich and Spike  
Island, are to be sent to Gibraltar, to be employed as  
slaves on the public works.
