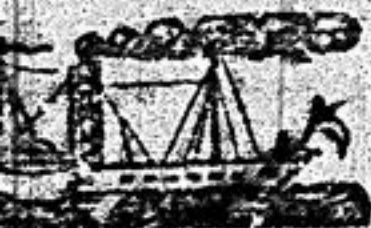

THE LIMERICK CHRONICLE.

SATURDAY EVENING, NOV. 8.

The following section of the new act is that under which the penalties are imposed upon persons brought up by the Police:—14 and 15 Vic, c. 92, s. xiii. p. 3. Any person who shall in any manner wilfully or by negligence or misbehaviour prevent or interrupt the free passage of any person or carriage on any public road, or street, or crossing, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 20s.

The fervid meteor observed in Limerick on Thursday last, as described in the CHRONICLE, was a Comet discovered on the 22d of last month at the observatory of Baron Senftenburg, in Bavaria. On the morning of October 23 the new comet was in right ascension 13h 42m and north declination 32° 50'. The right ascension increases 6m 17s daily, and the comet approaches the North Pole at the rate of 1½° in the same interval. It may be sought in the northern part of the constellation Bootes, and unless its brightness has very much diminished an ordinary night glass will suffice to show it without difficulty.
