

In *Allen v. Lloyd*, High Sheriff, Limerick, the Queen's Bench yesterday decided that in the case of rowing crops the sheriff was right in making the return of nulla bona to plaintiff's execution, when the landlord's claim was not satisfied.

COMMON PLEAS—In the case of *M'Kenna v. De Moleyns*, which was also tried before Sergeant Howly at the Kerry assizes, the Court gave judgment, allowing the cause shewn against the conditional order for new trial, and confirming the ruling of the Judge below, allowing amendments to be made in the record on the trial.
