HORRIBLE MURDER.

Between ten and eleven o'clock on Thursday night, a man named Cleary, land bailiff to Edward Davenport, Esq. was found dead on the road within a short distance of his own residence at Beigh Church, near Askeaton, in this county, having been shot thro' the heart, with either a gun or pistol. He had been collecting rents same day, and before leaving Askeaton for home was seen to load a pistol which he placed in his coat pocket, and he had £11 in his possession. When the body was discovered, the pistol above referred to was found in the breast pocket of deceased, but discharged, and the money gone.

FURTHER PARTICULARS.

On Wednesday night last about 11 o'clock a m, a man named James Cleary was robbed and murdered at Caherduff, within about a mile of Askeaton. The deceased was a pensioner, and had been lately employed as a driver or under agent by Rev Mr Evans, of Knockaderra, near Newcastle, from whom he held a house at Caherduff. He also did business for Mr Edward Davenport, of Ballinacourty, in this county. An inquest was held on the body this day by Thomas Enright, Esq. coroner, and a verdict of wilful murder returned against some person or persons unknown. The unfortunate victim must have been murdered with his own pistol, and death must have been instantaneous, as the bullet entered the left side, passed thro' the left lung, entering the heart, which it also passed through, and lodged in the back. A post mortem examination was made on the body by Dr White, of Askeaton, who with much skill traced the bullet to its lodgment. The perpetrators of this diabolical crime, after shooting Cleary, carried off the pistol, and also robbed him of about £12, which he had received the day previous as rent for Mr Davenport. E J Collins, Esq. R.M. and Thomas Smith, Esq. S.I. attended the inquest. The Askeaton, Tubrid and Miltown police have been on the alert to procure evidence, but as yet there is no clue to the murderers. The funeral, which took place immediately after the inquest, was only attended by about a dozen persons. Cleary had been in Askeaton the day of the murder, warning some tenants to have their rent ready on a future day, and was returning home when he was waylaid and murdered. The place he was shot at was close to a house on the road side, and so close to his own dwelling that his sister in law heard the report, but the inmates of the houses nearer to the scene of murder deny hearing the shot, and he was not found till about 3 o'clock on Thursday morning, when his wife went to look for him. The deceased was a respectable man and had the confidence of his employers. He has left a wife and two children who are penniless.
