The tolls to be levied at the same gate as at present, and according to the terms specified in schedule, in the hands of the Limerick Harbour Commissioners secretary. Approved security will be required, and the persons offering to become security must be in attendance, to join in monthly notes or acceptances. A month's payment in advance will be required. The following are to be exempted from toll viz:—The Mayor and his officers, when on duty; the Harbour Commissioners and the Secretary, the Collector and Clerks, the Harbour Master, and Dockmen, all as foot passengers; and the Engineers and all persons employed by the Harbour Commissioners in repairs of the Bridge, Dock, or Quay Works, with their assistants and workmen; also all Carriers or Cars employed loading or discharging vessels from the Quay at the North-strand, and any any other conditions, if necessary, will be announced previous to the sale.
