The debate on the Maynooth grant was resumed on yesterday forenoon, Mr Sergeant Murphy and Mr Freshfield in opposition, Mr Attorney General Napier and Mr Drummond in support of Mr Spooner. The debate was adjourned to eight o'clock afternoon, when the motion was dropped, owing to a sufficiency of members not being present. The chief supporters of Government were absent.

That superior ship *Jane Black*, Capt Gorman, which left this on the 7th April, arrived at Quebec on 5th May, and landed all her passengers well; she is expected here the latter end of June.

A letter from Captain Ferguson, of the ship *Primrose*, has this day been received by Messrs. Jas. Harvey & Co., owners of the vessel, announcing her safe arrival in Quebec, on the 3d inst. after a fine passage of 24 days. The passengers were all landed in good health.
