curate, the Rev Mr Meade, had a most providential
escape from being poisoned on Thursday, when there
was veal for dinner, and the cook required flour for
the dressing. She searched some drawers, and lighting
upon a brown paper in which was some white lead,
and supposing it to be the article she wanted, used it
freely over the veal, while before the fire. Mr Roughtan
and curate dined off it, and both noticed that it had
some extraordinary flavour. Soon after they were
seized with serious illness. No time was lost in send-
ing for medical assistance, and it required the united
skill of Drs Ryan and O'Grady, to preserve the lives
of the Priests and the servant. A dog in the kitchen,
who had lapped the dripping, was found dead.

On Monday last the mortal remains of the late
Daniel Fitzgerald Gabbett, Esq. late 12th Lancers,
were removed from the residence of his uncle, Rev

the tenants of deceased arrived to pay a mark of re-
spect by attending the funeral of their lamented
landlord. At half past 7 o'clock the coffin, covered in
black cloth, was placed in the funeral carriage, drawn
by six horses in sable trappings. The procession was
headed by a large number of well mounted tenants
wearing linen scarfs and hat bands, also a large num-
ber of laborers wearing hat bands; next the servant
women of the family with white hoods and cloaks;
several of the neighbouring clergy with scarf and hat
bands. After the hearse were the carriages of Rev
Joseph Gabbett, Wm Gabbett, Esq. city high sheriff,
Daniel Gabbett, Esq. North strand, uncles of de-
ceased; Capt Tuthill, late Queen's Bays, brother in
law of deceased; Rev. Thomas Westropp, Henry
Maunsell, Esq.; C. Coote, Esq. Mount Coote;
James Ievers, Esq., Glenfield; Mrs. Fitzgibbon,
William Gabbett, Esq., Caherline; William Gab-
bett, of Mount Minnett; John Fitzgerald, Esq.
Joseph Gubbins, Esq. Dr Bennett, of Kilmallock,
Rev Pryce Peacocke, James Worrall, Esq. The pro-
cession passed through the towns of Kilmallock and
Bruff, where the shops were closed as a mark of re-
spect. The funeral service was read by the Rev
Matthew Moore, rector of Caherconlish after which
the coffin was placed in the family vault. The funeral
arrangements were made by Mr John James, of
George's-street, upholsterer.
