DEATHS.

At Lahinch, on Wednesday last, after an illness of several
 weeks duration, Thomas Worrall, Esq. of George's-street,
 Limerick, to the profound grief of his family and the universal
 regret of his fellow-citizens. By the death of this excellent
 gentleman the commercial and social circles of Limerick have
 sustained a loss not easily to be repaired. In the export trade
 he uniformly ranked as a merchant of the highest character and
 intelligence, whose opinion and advice in commercial matters
 gave assurance of mature, unbiassed judgment; and in private
 life, it is no flattery to record his great moral worth, his ever
 kindly feelings, frank and inoffensive manners. Mr. Worrall
 was one of the senior members of our Chamber of Commerce,
 whose windows were closed on the intelligence of his death. All
 the ships in harbour also suspended their colours half-mast
 high. His remains were this day interred in the family vault
 at Killaloe, followed by a most respectable cortege of carriages
 from Limerick.
