The Constabulary force from the co Limerick, on
duty at Six mile Bridge, are enduring extreme hard-
ship, having to lay down (not sleep) in their clothes
each night on loose straw, in low, confined, unven-
tilated hovels, while the Clare men, brought in on the
same duty, are provided with lodgings in the village.
This is not proper, and half the force now in Six mile
Bridge are in danger of sickness from typhus fever.

Every job car in Limerick was in requisition to Six
mile bridge on Sunday last, and about 300 respectable
persons assembled in the village, desirous, not alone
of witnessing the *locale* of the homicides, but the more
attractive display of a military encampment, to which
the visitors were admitted, by order of Lt Col Douglas
A. A. G. Lt Col Barlow, 14th, was most considerate
in allowing Limerick visitors every privilege within
the lines.

Friday night last a young man, named John Riordan,
was waylaid and murdered in the neighbourhood
of Sallymount, Castle Connell, where he resided. The
body was found next morning, and Mr Costelloe,
coroner, held an inquest on the remains. Verdict—
Wilful murder against person or persons unknown.
Suspicion attaches to three brothers of the name of
Farrell, in the same neighbourhood, whose sister
Riordan had seduced, and deserted.
