Mr Pierce Fitzgerald, solicitor, has memorialled the Lord Chancellor for the removal of Capt Wm P White from the commission of the peace for Cork, whose alleged offence is the committal of election rioters in default of bail.

Mr Charles Barry Baldwin, a gentleman of large estate in King's county, and late member for Totness borough, has obtained £150 damages against a printer there for publishing a false and slanderous libel on his private character during the late election.

Capt Sullivan, sentenced to imprisonment by the Recorder of Cork, for assault on Mr Hardy, one of the stewards of the Exhibition ball, will be liberated by order of the Lord Lieutenant on Saturday next.
