On Monday, Thomas Costelloe, Esq. held an in-  
quest on the body of John Shaughnessy, a smith,  
who was conveyed to Barrington's hospital in a state  
of destitution and on the brink of eternity, it having  
been alleged that he had not tasted food for three  
days previously. The jury after examining witnesses  
returned the following verdict:—Died from destitu-  
tion and want of nourishment, and no blame attribu-  
table to the relieving officer, as deceased refused to  
apply for it.
