The Earl and Countess of Seafield have arrived at Brighton.

Mr James Marshall put up for sale on Monday last at his Commercial Mart, by order of the Commissioners, the fee farm estate of George and George Joseph Crowe, in the parish of Nantenan, barony of Lower Connelloe, county of Limerick. The attendance was very good, and the bidding spirited. The 1st lot, Ballyhomac, 222 statute acres, net yearly rental, £106 was knocked down to the Rev George Gough Gubbins, for £910, after Michael Quin, Esq. had bid up to £900. Ballyadam, 83 acres, net rental, £43, sold to Mr Thomas M'Namara for £750. Dohilebeg, 180 acres, yearly rent, £28, Mr Gubbins, £580. Dohill woodland, 55 acres, yearly value, £30, sold to Mr Bevan for £430. Dohile east, 106 acres, yearly value £47; Mr Bevan for £810. The above property realised in Limerick £1000 over what the Commissioners were offered for it in Dublin.

David Fitzgerald, a small farmer, was found dead near Doon, in this county, on Saturday night. Seven men are in custody, resulting from a verdict of wilful murder after an inquest by Mr Costelloe.

Every article of sustenance for the table, meat, butter, milk, bread, and potatoes are rising alarmingly in price at the Limerick market. The baker's loaf is not one third the size and weight.

Sunday last, a meeting of the electors of Athlone was held at Rourke's hotel, Dr O'Connell in the chair, to receive Solicitor General Keogh, who addressed the meeting, and was received with great enthusiasm, after which it was unanimously resolved — That our tried representative, the Solicitor General for Ireland, having explained the circumstances under which he accepted office in the government of the Earl of Aberdeen, we are of opinion that he has fearfully satisfied us of the prudence and consistency of his acceptance of office, and we pledge ourselves to give him our support in this Borough.

At Oughterard Quarter Sessions a jury was sworn to try the case of Sullivan v Rev John O'Callaghan, for loss and injury sustained in consequence of a malicious prosecution. Plaintiff was in the employment of defendant as bible reader in Oughterard. Sullivan summoned the Rev Mr O'Callaghan before the magistrates for his wages. On the hearing of the case the Rev Mr O'Callaghan caused notes to be taken of plaintiff's evidence, and subsequently had him brought up at petty sessions on a charge of perjury. The magistrates
