during which time he served his employers faithfully and
with great diligence. He was a young man of amiable
and conciliating manners, kind and charitable disposition,
humane and feeling to those under him—as a proof he never
changed one of his crew from the day he first sailed for Jamaica
to his death. As a seaman he possessed skill, judgment, and
knowledge, with undaunted courage and resolution. He served
a regular apprenticeship out of Limerick, and was afterwards
sent to Green Row College, Cumberland, to be further in-
structed in all the necessary branches of his profession ; and
there is in the hands of his family a letter from the principal of
that college, bearing testimony to his conduct, diligence, and
acquirements. When in command of a vessel out of this port
he was celebrated for making extraordinary swift trading voy-
ages ; and in Halifax his memory is cherished, and his loss re-
gretted by his employers. All the Halifax papers bear testi-
mony to his virtues.
