Private letters from the seat of war in India report

**DEATH BY DROWNING**—On Thursday evening three  
men belonging to the brig *Filey*, of North Shields,  
were drowned in the river at Howley's-quay, a plat-  
form upon which they were standing, while engaged  
painting the vessel's side, having given way, in conse-  
quence of the second mate and carpenter, Robert  
Ridley, having suddenly leaped over deck upon the  
plank, thereby causing the rope from which the plank  
was suspended to snap asunder. The carpenter was  
one of the victims, the names of the other two being  
Thomas Witch and Thomas Clarke, whose bodies  
have not been yet found. Drs. Griffin and Kavanagh  
principally attended to restore animation, at J. N. Rus-  
sell's kiln, where Ridley was brought, but all human  
skill was unavailible. Dr Murphy, Coroner, held  
an inquest yesterday at Barrington's Hospital, on  
the body of Ridley, when a verdict of accidental  
death was returned.

Since Lord and Lady Ashtown's arrival at Clonod-  
foy Castle, in this county, the annual distribution of  
clothing has been made to the members of the Castle  
Oliver Clothing Club. Lady Ashtown superintended  
the proceedings, and shewed every attention to the  
wants of the clothiers who held tickets of membership.  
The advantages of this society are much prized by the  
poor, as, whatever the weekly savings made towards  
an annual supply of clothing, Lady Ashtown gene-  
rously adds as much more, and takes the trouble of  
procuring the clothing in quantity at wholesale prices,  
at which they are again sold to the members. The  
bazaar was laid out in the old mansion of Castle  
Oliver, and a refreshment room adjoined, where the  
several members of the society, with those of their  
families who came to assist in their purchases, were  
plentifully supplied with refreshments.
