An action of ejectment for non payment of rent, to recover possession of part of the lands of Coolealeen, barony of Ibrickan, Clare. Robt O'Brien, Esq. proved that the lands were demised by the late Sir Edward O'Brien to the Dowager Lady O'Brien, and that 3 half year's rent was due by the defendants, for whom there was no appearance. Verdict for plaintiffs.
