The Rev Mr Malone, R C chaplain to Kildala union,  
has apologised for the intemperate and insulting lan-  
guage he made use of in his report book, in reference  
to the consecration of the workhouse burial ground  
by the Lord Bishop of Tuam. There was no alternative  
but dismissal by sealed order of the Commissioners.

On Thursday Dr Murphy, coroner, held an inquest  
at Barrington's hospital, on the body of a sailor found  
drowned same morning near the new docks. The body  
was in a state of decomposition, and supposed to be  
that of one of the crew of the ship *Filey*, of North  
Shields, who was drowned at the lower quays in Jan-  
uary, owing to a stage upon which three were standing  
having given way. Verdict, "found drowned."

Same day Dr Murphy, coroner, held an inquest at the  
County Infirmary on the body of Patrick Hunt, late run-  
ner at the Provincial Bank, whose death from the acci-  
dental puncture of a scissars in the arm, we recorded  
in our last. From the medical testimony it appeared  
that one of the principal arteries of the arm had been  
penetrated, and the jury returned a verdict that Patk.  
Hunt died on the 8th inst., from inflammation of his arm  
produced by a punctured wound, and that said wound  
was inflicted accidentally.

John Molony, a lunatic, died in the City gaol on  
Thursday.

Judge Perrin, who charged the Kerry Grand Jury,  
said he had but very few observations to make on  
the calandar, as the cases were few in number, and  
but light in their nature. Sir Colman O'Leighlen,  
Bart, Q C, on behalf the *Kerry Examiner* opposed  
the fiatting of a presentment for £170, made by the  
grand jury to the *Kerry Evening Post*, for printing  
county documents, on the ground that his client  
offered to do the work by his tender for £148; and  
the grand jury were bound to accept the lowest  
tender. Judge Perrin said that it was a question for  
the grand jury under the statute to consider which  
newspaper had the best circulation, and was most  
likely to further the interests of the public. They  
should act as a private individual would, and consider  
what was best for the general good. The present-  
ments were then referred back to the grand jury.

The taxation of Kerry is reduced £1000 since last  
assizes. The tenement valuation of the county is  
completed with the exception of Magourney barony.  
The Board of Superintendence of the County jail  
asked for no presentment to defray expenses of food  
fuel, and other necessaries, having £1206 in hands.  
The presentment passed for salaries was £896 and  
£117 for superannuation allowances. There are forty  
prisoners for trial at the Assizes. The civil business  
is light, only two records for trial.
