The following from the "Belfast Mercantile Journal," is analogous to Limerick as well as Belfast:—"A fact we have brought under the notice of the public confirms this statement, that the sum collected annually at our Custom house is far from the amount contributed by our consumption. The duties paid in other ports, to our account, amounting to an addition of full 50 per cent." In connection with this subject we may refer to the remarkable fact, that towns so prosperous as Belfast or Limerick should draw so large a proportion of supplies coastwise from other ports.
