GREAT MUNSTER FAIR—Lord Clarina presided at
a meeting of the Commissioners of the Great Munster
Fair, held this afternoon at three o'clock, at the
office of the secretary, (Robert Anglim, Esq.) George-
st. There were 43 members in attendance, including
the High Sheriff of the County, the Mayor, Francis
Spaight, Esq. President of the Chamber of Commerce,
Robert Maxwell, Esq. Henry Maunsell, Esq. John
Watson Mahony, Esq. Robert Hunt, Esq. George
Fosbery, Esq. Robert Rodger, Esq., William
Franklin, Esq., Massy Dawson, Esq. and a
number of the leading agriculturists of Limerick, Clare
and Tipperary. A report from committee, which
met in the early part of the day, was read and adopted,
fixing Tuesday and Wednesday, 27th and 28th Sept.
for holding the next Autumn Fair. The minutes
of a special meeting, held on the 30th of April,
were also read, recommending that a suitable
testimonial should be presented to John Long, Esq.,
CE, in acknowledgment of his early and indefatigable
labours to establish the Munster Fair, and to pro-
mote the agriculture and commerce of Munster. A
resolution was unanimously adopted to carry out
the project, and a sum of £46 was collected in
