transmitted to another party for him, and was closed
upon. Thomas Costelloe, Esq., Coroner, held an in-

workhouse. Thomas Bourke and Denis Lynch, for
breaches of the Road act, were fined in small penalties.

At the City Petty sessions yesterday the Magistrates
were engaged two hours investigating a case in which
sub Constable Thompson, City Police, was defendant,
and Catherine Connell, of Boherbuoy, complainant.—
The charge was for illegally breaking into her house
after 12 o'clock at night, but evidence of the strongest
character was given to show that the female keeps a
brothel, and that the policeman went to her house in
search of a robber, and that the door was opened for
him. The Bench unanimously dismissed the case, and
ordered the complainant to be summoned for keeping
