The only case of importance was that of the Queen v. Grady, the sweep, for taking an apprentice, and using with cruelty, the young boy Hartigan, who was sold by his depraved mother for 7s., as already fully detailed in our columns. The child was brought forward and deposed to having been frequently lashed and beaten by Grady for not succeeding in ascending chimney flues. The Bench ordered informations against Grady, and the mother, who, in default of bail were committed for trial.

The hearing of summonses issued at suit of the Excise v. a Hotel Keeper of this city, for selling spirits, beer, and wine, without license, was adjourned till next Court day, upon application of the defendant's attorney. It appears that the beer and spirit licenses were not renewed last October, through neglect, and that a retail wine license was never taken out, same being deemed unnecessary. The detection in the latter instance was made by one of the Excise Officers, who called and paid for, a single glass of wine.

Informations were ordered against James Courtney, for stealing a large lump of butter; and against four females of ill-repute, for keeping brothels in the neighbourhood of Boherbuoy. The parties were prosecuted by Mr. Shiels, Inspector of Lodging Houses, and who was accompanied by Mr. Hayes, Inspector of St. Michael's Night Watch, when the detections were made. Six persons brought up by Mr. Hayes, for being drunk and annoying the streets, were committed to gaol for 7 days each, and a number of vagrants arrested on suspicion of larceny, were discharged, the parties by whom they were given in charge not appearing to prosecute.

Sir John Benson informs the Cork harbour board that he this week went to Ring and examined the site of the intended pier. He found a rock about 18 inches below low water not marked; 16 feet wide and 25 feet long, such as no boat could approach it. There were two ways to avoid the difficulty—to cut away the rock or extend the pier beyond it. The latter was the preferable one. It was agreed he should extend the pier as far as necessary to avoid the rock.

Wm C Judd, Esq. Sussex Terrace, Hyde Park, son in law of the late George Gloster, Esq. who is on a visit to his estates in Clare, got £112s 6d each for 35 three year old heifers on Thursday, at the fair of Loughrea.

Yesterday, Thomas Costello, Esq. coroner, held an inquest at Doon, on the body of Mary Hayes, who was found dead in her house, with blood upon her dress. The jury found upon the medical evidence that she died from the rupture of a blood vessel.
