The remains of the deceased Lady Caroline Adelaide
Quin, eldest daughter of the Earl and Countess of Dun-
raven, were interred yesterday in the mausoleum of the
noble family, adjoining Adare Church, attended by all
the gentry of the neighbourhood and a multitude of the
tenantry, whose mournful subdued bearing frequently
relieved itself in sighs and tears for the loss of one so
beloved by all the people of Adare. The impressive
funeral service was read by the Rev. Messrs. Croker,
Beere, and Graves.

Saturday night last this city was the scene of a most
disgraceful exhibition, when crowds paraded the streets
carrying upon their shoulders a stretcher, upon which a
coffin was placed, purporting to contain an effigy of
Colonel Vandeleur, dressed in white, body half uplifted,
and hands outstretched. A tar barrel blazed in rere
of this demoniacal rout, and the yelling and shout-
ing was terrific. Having passed through George's-
street and by the Police barrack, those engaged
in this brutal display, consigned the coffin and
effigy to the flames, amidst ferocious yells of execration
and delight, two buck sweeps pretending to read a
funeral service from cabbage leaves over the sup-
posed victim. Bonfires were lighted near Saint
Mary's Roman Catholic chapel, John-street, Broad-st.
the old Square, Boherbuoy, Grrryowen, the North
Strand, &c. The mountains of Clare were in one blaze
till an early hour on Monday morning.

At Parteen a bonfire was lighted up on the highway,
but the police stationed there extinguished the mater-
ials. At length the incendiaries obtained the key of
the chapel yard, and there raised their bonfire, near
the monument of the late Mr. Honan, mayor of
Limerick!

There was great tumult at Kilkee on Saturday even-
ing, when Rev. Mr. Comyn, P.P. seized hold of Jonas
Studdert, Esq. J.P. upon whom some of the respec-
table visitors there had called to prevent the
discharge of shots in a crowd shouting at the defeat of
Colonel Vandeleur as candidate for Clare. Mr. Stud-
dert directed the Police party to take the gun from an
unqualified person who was firing shots, and as the
Rev. Mr. Comyn saw that a dangerous riot was immi-
nent he at once released his grasp of the magistrate, for
a cordial shake of that gentleman's hand, bid the
riotous crowd to disperse, as they were all good friends,
