THE NEW FLOATING DOCK.—It is with much plea-
sure we announce that within the last few days the
spacious basin of our new Docks has been filled from
the river sluices, and the extent of accommodation for
vessels of large tonnage, successfully tested at high and
low water, to a depth of from 14 to 23 feet. When
charged, the sluices were closed, and the capabilities
of the ponderous iron flood-gates brought to bear in a
most satisfactory manner, so that in a short time the
dock will open for reception of shipping.

The Lords of the Treasury have written to the Cor-

The duty on foreign refined sugar is reduced from

head, from the effects of which she died soon after in
Barrington's hospital.
