CORONERS' INQUEST-At the City Assizes opposition was raised by the Grand Jury before Judge Perrin to presentments applied for by Dr. Murphy, and Thos. Costelloe, Esq. Coroners, for inquests held upon the bodies of persons who had died suddenly. The Grand Jury submitted that there was no necessity to hold inquests in cases of sudden death, apparent from natural causes, but his Lordship thought otherwise, and not only flated the Coroners presentments but directed that in all cases of sudden death it was their bounden duty to hold inquests.

As the train which left Limerick last morning was starting from Pallas station Patrick Meara, who was seeing some friends off by it, lost his balance and fell down between the carriage and platform, sustaining injuries which resulted in death.
