LIMERICK MUSLIN WEAVING SCHOOL.—This institution has been opened in suitable premises in Prospect-row, in connection with a Glasgow house (M. Donald & Co.) for the instruction and employment of boys in the art of weaving muslin, a kind of fabric that can only be manufactured in the hand-loom, 50 of which are already set up, but as no wages can be paid for the first three months, a contribution is required for their support and maintenance during that period, when they will be enabled, with ordinary diligence and attention, to acquire sufficient knowledge and skill for earning an independent livelihood in this flourishing branch of industry.
