At Ballycastle petty sessions, Mayo, on Wednesday, the Rev. Wm. M'Dermott, R. C. curate, was summoned "for that he did unlawfully and wilfully burn and destroy 5 books of the Holy Scriptures, consisting of one English Bible, one English Testament, and 3 Irish Testaments," but the witness who swore information of the outrage having deviated upon examination from his depositions that he saw the priest burn them, the charge was dismissed, and the magistrat took informations against Patrick Foy for perjury.

A disgraceful profanation was offered last week to the Roman Catholic Chapel of Rathbarry, near Castlefreke. Some person entered the Chapel-yard and filled one of the holy water fonts with human excrement.

An inquest was held at Rathkeale yesterday, by Dr. Enright, coroner, on the body of Mr. Thomas O'Connell, cloth merchant, who came by his death under the following circumstances. About six o'clock on Thursday evening he called at the establishment of Dr. O'Hanlon, and complaining to a man behind the counter of being annoyed by rats, he bought an ounce of arsenic, and went back to his own shop, called for some whiskey and warm water, with which he mixed the arsenic and drank all in a draft. His family took no notice of what he did, as deceased was latterly in the habit of indulging freely. He then went to bed and in a short time called for his nephew and told him what he had done. Two medical men were immediately sent for, but all they could do was in vain, as the sufferer died in great agony in the course of the night. The jury returned a verdict that deceased came by his death in consequence of taking poison while laboring under temporary insanity.
