At Kilkee, Mr. William Roche, of Meelick, an extensive practical agriculturist, and a most benevolent, worthy man. His remains were interred this day at Manister, near Croom.  
 On the 13th ulto, of malignant yellow fever, at Kingston, Jamaica, J. M. Wilson, Esq. 3rd West India Regiment, eldest son of John Maryon Wilson, Esq. of Fitzjohns, Essex, and son-in-law of John Boyse, Esq. of Oatlands, near this City.  
 At his residence in Jermyn-street, London, aged 56 years, to the afflicting loss of wife and children, and to the great regret of partners and friends, William Callanane, Esq. formerly of this City, and for many years a partner in the eminent wine house of Gould, Campbell, & Co., Oporto.  
 On the 8th August, at Sierra Leone, in the 34th year of his age, Joseph M. O'Neill, Esq. Queen's Advocate for that colony. His loss is deeply mourned by his relatives and friends, for a gentler or kinder heart never beat. Possessed of rare endowments, his short official career (commenced in 1850) won for him the universal respect and regard of the colonists, and every tribute which profound regret for his death could call forth was paid to his memory in Freetown.
