With unfeigned regret have we to record the death of HENRY O'GRADY, Esq. of The Grange, who departed this life, after a long and painful illness, at Grange House, on Wednesday last, to the irrepressible grief of a most affectionate family circle, watching, with intense solicitude, the last moments of a beloved relative; and to the profound regret of his numerous friends and respectable tenantry, who regarded him with almost parental veneration. In the County of Limerick, where the name of "Henry O'Grady" was ever associated with all that is perfectly gentlemanlike, honorable, and benevolent, in every stage of his virtuous career, it would be superfluous to enumerate the many instances of his comprehensive charity, practical as it was liberal; of religion pure and und-filed, manifested in every word and act of his exemplary life. Sincere and steadfast in his friendship, and strictly observant of the moral and social duties, as country gentleman, magistrate, and grand juror, Mr. O'Grady was esteemed not less for the integrity of his principles, than the amenity of his manners, uniformly bland and amiable to a degree. Suffering much from a long and painful illness, his patience was often severely tried by acute affliction, but such was his naturally placid temper, that he never murmured; and the implicit confidence he felt in the all-saving blood of Christ the Saviour, soothed the pangs of death and prepared His servant for a glorious immortality. The remains of the late Henry O'Grady, Esq. were interred in the family cemetery at Knockany Church on this day.
