

Mr. Francis Scully has given notice of moving for an address to her Majesty on the 4th July, for the issuing of a commission to inquire into endowments for education in Ireland.

Athlunkard Bridge tolls were let on Saturday last by the Commissioners from the 20th inst. for one year, at the rent of £274 to Messrs. Caswell and Atkinson, which sum exhibits an increase of £30 over last year's letting.

John Williams, a seaman who had shipped on board the barque Janes, of Sunderland, bound for Quebec with passengers, and now lying in the docks, fell into the river near the steam-boat quay, on Sunday morning and was drowned. Dr. Murphy, coroner, held an inquest upon the body, next day, at the Exchange—Verdict, "accidental death by drowning."

There are only 4 cases for trial at the assizes for the Queen's County. Three of them are for vagrancy.

George Warburton, Esq. brother to Captain Warburton, of Garryhinch, King's County, was a passenger by the Hannah Maria from London and Plymouth to Port Adelaide, and wrecked near Portland bay, and the neglect on the part of the Captain and owners, which he complains of, is deserving of severe notice. The crown instituted a prosecution against Capt. Drew, who was committed to take his trial last November. Witnesses were bound over and the trial was postponed till February; but as the witnesses could not be got Captain Drew was discharged.

A young lady named Anne Curran, residing with her parents in Pagenalstown, county Carlow, after managing to extract £200 of her father's, eloped with a policeman stationed near that town, named M'Goff, and arrived at Liverpool on Wednesday, intending to leave in the first vessel for the "land of gold." But "the course of true love never did "run smooth," as Miss Curran and her love swain were waited for by one of the detective force of Liverpool, who had received instructions by telegraph, and on their arrival Head Constable M'Hale arrested them. Upwards of £120 of the money was got with the prisoners, who were sent back to Dublin on Wednesday.
