Friday last the body of a female was discovered by a woman who lives near Castlemahon, in this county, concealed in a heap of earth, convenient to her residence. Attention was directed to the spot by seeing dogs resorting the place, whom she observed devouring some thing. The body was devoid of the right arm and thigh, the other thigh had the flesh torn off, and there was a large wound on the head. A man named Ward has been arrested, there being circumstantial evidence that the body was that of his wife, they not having been on good terms for some time. An inquest was held on Saturday, and the proceedings were adjourned until Tuesday, when the subject will be investigated at the court of Newcastle.
