The probability of immediate Peace with Russia is hopeless, and the Czar will not be induced to strike under until all his great warlike resources are exhausted. The address of the Emperor Louis Napoleon to the Imperial Guards at Paris, confirms our belief that negotiation is purely childish, so long as Sebastopol remains the stronghold of Russia in the Black Sea.
