The probability of immediate Peace with Russia is hopeless, and the Czar will not be induced to strike under until all his great warlike resources are exhausted. The address of the Emperor Louis Napoleon to the Imperial Guards at Paris, confirms our belief that negotiation is purely childish, so long as Sebastopol remains the stronghold of Russia in the Black Sea. "My voice is still for war," is the text of a Potentate, who knows the Czar well; and Peace, we repeat, is hopeless, until the Allies, with "the strong hand uppermost," plant their colours upon the fortifications of Sebastopol.

The remains of the late Lady Anna Maria Monsell arrived in Limerick on Wednesday night, and were conveyed direct to Mr. Monsell's mansion, Tervoe, where mourning relatives and friends attended upon the deceased until 10 o'clock this morning, when the funeral procession left for Kilkeedy Church, Mr. Monsell and the Earl of Dunraven, chief mourners, accompanied by Lord Clarina, a large number of the gentry, and by multitudes of the tenantry and poor cottiers, whose tears, more significant than words, proclaimed a grievous loss to their families by Lady Monsell's death. The Rev. Richard Dickson, assisted by the Rev. J. B. Monsell, read the solemn burial service, amid ill-suppressed throbs of grief. Amongst the other clergymen present we observed the Rev. Joseph Gabbett, Rev. G. Beere, Rev. Augustus Maunsell, Rev. Pryce Peacocke and Rev. W. T. Seymour. Several Roman Catholic Clergymen also attended the obsequies. Exclamations of bitter anguish from women and children, filled the air, when the earthly tabernacle passed from their eyes to rest with its kindred dust, until the last loud trumpet shall call the elect to mansions of eternal bliss. Mr. Henry Owens, of this City, personally superintended all the funeral arrangements, which were conducted throughout in the most respectable and satisfactory manner.
