Mr. Sheehy handed in the following notice of motion at the Limerick board of guardians on Wednesday last:—“That we respectfully call on the Poor Law Commissioners to use their influence with Parliament in having the law amended as regards the chargeability of paupers in towns governed by municipal bodies or commissioners, as in consequence of the numerous evictions and house-tumbings which have taken place in the rural districts during the famine, they were compelled to seek refuge in towns and cities, where they became chargeable after some time. And we respectfully suggest that the classes ‘orphans and deserted children’ under 15 years of age, and all ‘the aged and infirm,’ for the purpose of this amendment be charged on the union at large.”

Thos. Moran, Patrick Crohan, and James Daly, deserters from the 39th Depot at Cork, were arrested in this city by Constable Nash, and having acknowledged their offence before the Magistrates yesterday, were ordered to be transmitted to Cork.

Thomas Costelloe, Esq. Coroner, held an inquest on Wednesday at the Police Station, George's-quay, on the body of the man found drowned the morning previous in the Canal. Deceased was identified as Michael Enright, a cab driver, lately in the employ of a car proprietor in this City, but originally from Kilrush, and who had been missing since Christmas Eve. The jury returned a verdict of “found drowned.”
