CITY PETTY SESSIONS, YESTEDAY.—There were 7
Magistrates on the Bench. A case at suit of Constable
Frawley, against 4 pawnbrokers, for taking into pledge
articles from a washerwoman named Mary Lynch, was
dismissed, as the goods were given to the owners;
John Corcoran, a cooper, was fined £3 or 2 months
imprisonment, for deserting the employment of Mr.
Michael M'Mahon, without notice, and contrary to
agreement; and Mr. T. Walshe, by whom Corcoran
was so employed, after being noticed not to do so,
was fined 5*l*.

At the County Petty sessions on Thursday, two
workhouse paupers were each sentenced to a months
imprisonment, for rioting in the establishment; six
persons were fined in mitigated penalties for road
nuisances.

FATAL ACCIDENT.—On Thursday, a young man,
named Thomas Lynch, servant to Mr. Hanly, of
High-street, was sent upon an errand with horse and
car to Thomondgate distillery, and when passing the
river slip convenient to the premises, turned the
horse to the water for drink. He was sitting upon
the shaft of the car at the time, and the horse having
made a sudden plunge into the river, was carried off
by the stream. The animal got disengaged from the
car, and swam to the Island at the other side, but,
melancholy to relate, Lynch perished, and his lifeless
body was picked up by Strand fishermen.

LIMERICK UNION.—Upon motion of Mr. W. Sheehy,
the guardians, at their last weekly meeting, adopted a
resolution calling upon the Poor Law Commissioners
to apply to Parliament for an alteration in law rela-
tive to the chargeability of paupers, as hundreds who
were evicted from the rural districts, and took refuge
in the City, subsequently became a burthen on the
ratepayers of the Borough, on admittance to the work-
house. It suggests that the orphans, deserted chil-
dren, and aged and infirm, shall be charged to the
Union at large.
