It is our melancholy duty to record the death of Maria Carroll, relict of James F. Carroll, Esq. M.D. of this city. She died of fever on Thursday morning, 19th inst. Mrs Carroll was 67 years of age, 18 of which she lived in honored widowhood, beloved, respected, and admired. Her life was hidden with GOD in CHRIST, and we doubt not she now enjoys the rich reward which He has promised to those who love and serve Him. Possessed of ample means, she expended them not in vanities and earthly comforts, but retrenched her own wants that she might have wherewithal, the more abundantly to provide for GOD's poor. Her example taught the rich the claims of poverty, and the poor trustfulness in the goodness, and providence and love of Him who said "Blessed are the Poor." Her alms were prudently distributed, abundant and unostentations. The charitable institutions will long mourn the loss of a benefactress who was ever ready to respond to their call, and will long hold her up to others as an example to be followed. She supported and consoled the widow—she was a mother to the orphan—to the destitute female a shield of protection against the perils and temptations of a sinful world, and her ears were never closed to the cry of distress. Her humility, her piety, her lively faith, her great zeal, her charity, are written in the book of life, and are known by all who ever heard her name.—*Apud Deum nota est, et apud homines.*
